Reflections by Pastor Keith

Several years ago we sanded our deck. Without thinking, I left a potted plant on the deck, and as a result sawdust settled on the leaves and before long, the leaves were wilting and falling off the plant. When we realized what we had done, we moved the plant, cleaned off the remaining leaves and watered the plant. The plant began to thrive.

Plants are tough. They keep on growing. That's what they do. It is their nature to grow.

And that is the way God has designed us as well. God made us to grow. Physically. Mentally. Emotionally. Socially. Vocationally. Spiritually. While growth in each of these ways is important and necessary, let's talk about spiritual growth.

So why is it, when it comes to spiritual growth, we grow a little and then think, "Oh, that should do it? I don't need to grow anymore." Plants don't do that. What would you do with a tomato plant which stopped growing as soon as it was 10 or 12 inches tall? We expect a tomato plant to keep on growing so that it will produce dozens and dozens of big, red, juicy tomatoes.

Now, we may not deliberately plan to stop growing, but that is what often happens. We go a few years

to Sunday School, maybe go through confirmation class, and then we stop. And we try to make it through life with the faith of a ten year old or a twelve year old. It doesn't work very well. God designed us to keep on growing as long as we live on this earth.

Jesus often talked about growing. Jesus told a parable about a mustard seed and how the small mustard seed grows into a large shrub and becomes a tree. (Matthew 13:31-32) Jesus said, that's the way it is in our life with God. Our faith, our love, our hope, our service, the fruits of the Spirit in our lives - God's plan is that we keep growing and growing.

In Colossians, Paul said, "*I want you to have all the riches of assured understanding and have the knowledge of God's mystery, that is, Christ himself.*" How do get you this understanding and knowledge? Through the Word of God.

In the letter to Thessalonians, we read, "*May the Lord so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God.*" How are your hearts strengthened? Through the Word of God.

Throughout the New Testament, there is the expectation that God's people just keep on growing.

The letter to the Ephesians says, *“We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine . . . But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ.”* (Ephesians 4:14-15)

Did you notice it doesn't say, “it would be nice if we grew a little,” or “we should grow?” No, the language is very strong: “We **MUST** grow.” How do we do that? Through the Word of God.

Plants grow when they receive water and fertilizer and sunshine. We grow spiritually when we receive the Word of God. Of course we receive the Word of God when we gather for worship, but one hour a week is hardly enough. It is barely a starvation diet. We need more. An old prayer of the church asks God to help us hear, read, mark, learn and inwardly digest the Holy Scriptures. That's what we need. We need to hear, read, mark, learn and inwardly digest the Word of God.

When it comes to the Bible, though, many feel inadequate, intimidated, scared. Yet, what would we say to a little boy who doesn't want to go to first grade because he can't read? Or what would we say to a girl who doesn't want to go to her algebra class because she doesn't know any algebra? We would say, the whole purpose is learning what you don't know. The purpose is to gain knowledge and understanding and confidence and the ability to put the knowledge and understanding into practice. It's called growth - and that's what God wants for you!

We have a great God, a God who loves you very much, a God who has made you into the very special person you are, a God who has rescued you from sin and death, a God who wants to be part of your life and help you live a great life. God has designed you to grow and to keep on growing. You never reach the limit. There is always more to discover, always more to understand, always more to master. You never arrive, you are always becoming - always becoming the new person God is seeking to form and shape in you.

Let's keep growing so that we can become all that God has made us to be!
