Reflections from Pastor Keith

I remember when I was in high school and on the track team. I ran in the 880 yard relay. I was usually the third runner. In those days the two best runners ran first and fourth, with the slower runners in the second and third position. That was me, a little slower, but at least I was on the team. And I didn't want to let the team down.

We practiced. Every day we practiced. We ran sprints. We ran long distances. And we practiced passing the baton. Races can be won or lost as the baton is passed from one runner to the next. I practiced and practiced. I didn't want to be the one who let the team down. I lived in dread of dropping the baton. That would be absolutely horrible, for then the race would surely be lost.

Generations come and go, they say. And it is true. But there is that all important passing of the baton from one generation to the next. It has been said that Christianity is just one generation away from extinction. If any generation fails to pass the baton on to the next generation, then the faith dies.

Thank God that for thousands of years the generations have been faithful. The faith has been passed on from one generation to the next until finally it has come to us. And

now it is our turn to pass the faith on to others.

Each year on All Saints Sunday (the first Sunday in November), we remember those who have gone before us and who passed the baton of faith to us. We thank God for them. We thank God that they passed the faith on to us.

Now it is our turn. It is our turn to sing the praises of God each week. It is our turn to teach the faith. It is our turn to serve those in need. It is our turn to finance the work of the church. It is our turn to reach out to our neighbors and invite them to faith in Christ.

After all, if we don't, who will? Who will pass on the love of God? Who will tell the story of Jesus? Who will tell the Christmas story of his birth? Who will tell the Epiphany story of his baptism and ministry? Who will tell the Lenten story of his passion and death? Who will tell the Easter story of his resurrection? Who will tell the Ascension story of his Kingly rule? Who will tell the Pentecost story of the coming of God's mighty Spirit?

If we don't, who will? Who will announce the forgiveness of sins? Who will offer a word of hope and encouragement? Who will take towel in hand and wash the feet of

those who are tired and worn out? Who will take bread in hand and feed the hungry? Who will proclaim the good news that God has come to save us? Who will do this? It is our turn to pass on the baton of faith.

Long ago the prophet Isaiah urged the people to have strong faith. Don't give up, he said. Don't drop the baton. There is a prize for those who win the race. In chapter 25 we read, "The Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines. . . And the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth."

That's the prize awaiting you as well. Take the words of Isaiah to heart. Know that God is planning a great party for you. Keep working hard. Be diligent about your ministry. Don't give up. Don't drop the baton. The team is counting on you. God is counting on you. And God wants to help you.

Down through the years God has fed his people with a special meal. Food to give them strength. Food to give them energy. Food to give them stamina. Food to give them courage. Food to help them in the race. A simple meal, but oh, so powerful! Bread and wine. But not just bread and wine. There's more. Much more. For in and with the bread and wine comes Christ. The Body of Christ. The Blood of Christ. Christ is the real power in this meal. This is the food we need - the food we need often!

Come and eat. This meal is for you. It is the family meal. It is for you and for all the saints. This meal will help you be faithful and do your ministry. This meal will help you pass on the faith to others.

To my knowledge, God doesn't have a back up plan. God is counting on us to pass on the faith. God is counting on each of us! All

of us are needed! Isn't it incredible that God would entrust such vital work to folks like you and me? And yet, that is exactly what God does!

Keep the faith. Love God. Love others. Be the people of God!
