Reflections by Pastor Kaylie

October 4th is the Feast Day of Saint Francis of Assisi, or the Day of Animal Blessings!

Francis of Assisi is known as the Patron Saint of Animals, Merchants, and Ecology. Born into a rich family, he abandoned his luxurious life after hearing God's voice. It is said that the voice told him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. St. Francis is said to have done several miracles through the help of God, and for his compassion for the vulnerable, poor and sick people, and animals. He was said to have healed a person with leprosy, prayed with birds, and tamed a wild wolf attacking a community. St. Francis of Assisi devoted his life to serving people, the land, and animals.

On the 4th may we remember St. Francis, his works, and his missions. May we step outside to appreciate the land below our feet and the animals in our lives. May we walk together with more compassion and kindness for our neighbor, ourselves, and all living creatures!

Together we can pray the "Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi: the Prayer for Peace"

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;

where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.
O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

As the Church and the ELCA are everchanging, our Synod has asked the question "what does it mean to be Church today?" In part to answer this question, our synod adopted a new mission statement "United with Christ in baptism.

Traveling the way of Jesus. Joining God's reign of justice and radical love for the world." There are many ways we can be the Church today, the body of Christ, through various activities and various ways of giving. The ways we are the Church today, at Olsburg and Walsburg, will look a little different than our sibling Churches in Wichita. The hope with this new mission statement is that we continue to stay united with Christ in baptism, to remember that we are born from the same tradition and faith ancestors. That we believe in Christ Jesus, his life and ministry, and death and resurrection. In Jesus' baptism we were made dead to sin and

While the Church may change and start to look different may we trust in the Holy Spirit and God's promises. May we know we are deeply loved and held by the Creator. May God give us ears to listen, eyes to witness, voices to proclaim God's radical love, and hearts to burn brightly for God's mission- to love neighbor, ourselves, God, and all of this world.

My alma mater, Bethany College, recently invited me to lead the campus in a Communion Service. While I was preparing for this service, I came across Psalm 103 again. A psalm that is of thanksgiving, one that reminded me of the goodness of God, and showed me how far God's love goes to surround us. May we mindfully read through Psalm 103 said to be written by David, May the God of All bless you and keep you in all the days to come. May you feel God shine brightly on you when the sun touches your face. May the words of David enter into your soul and fill you with gladness. May you know you are a beloved child of God, deeply loved, and may you share this gladness and love with all those around you. Amen!

and your anger lasts only for a short time.
10 You never treat us as our sins deserve;
you don't repay us in kind for the injustices
we do.
11 For as high as heaven is above the
earth,
so great is the love for those who revere

that's how far you remove our sins from us!

that's how tenderly you treat your
worshippers, YHWH!
